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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The proposed widening of Tolo Highway and Fanling Highway between Island House Interchange and Fanling (the Project) is a Designated Project under the Environmental Impact Assessment Ordinance (Cap. 499) (EIAO). An Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Report (the approved EIA Report) together with an Environmental Monitoring and Audit (EM&A) Manual (the approved EM&A Manual) were completed and approved under the EIAO on 14 July 2000 (Register Number: EIA-043/2000).

The objective of the Project "Widening of Tolo Highway / Fanling Highway between Island House Interchange and Fanling" is to widen Tolo Highway and Fanling Highway to dual 4-lane carriageway in order to alleviate the current traffic congestion problems and to cope with the increasing transport demands to and from the urban areas and also cross boundary traffic.

The Project is a designated project and governed by an Environmental Permit (EP-324/2008) issued by the EPD on 23 December 2008. Subsequently, the EPD issued Variation of Environmental Permits of EP-324/2008/A, EP-324/2008/B and EP-324/2008/C on 31 January 2012, 17 March 2014 and 27 March 2015 respectively. The current valid VEP was applied on 19 August 2015 and the VEP (EP-324/2008/D) was subsequently granted on 27 August 2015.

The construction works for this Project are delivered in 2 stages i.e. Stage 1 (between Island House Interchange and Tai Hang) and Stage 2 (between Tai Hang and Wo Hop Shek Interchange). Stage 2 would be implemented under two works contracts. Contract No. HY2012/06 "Widening of Fanling Highway - Tai Hang to Wo Hop Shek Interchange" and the entrusted portion to CEDD under Contract No. CV/2012/09"Liantang/Heung Yuen Wai Boundary Control Point Site Formation and Infrastructure Works -Contract 3". This report focuses on Contract No. HY2012/06 "Widening of Fanling Highway - Tai Hang to Wo Hop Shek Interchange" in Stage 2 of the Project only.

Pursuant to the EP (EP-324/2008/D) Condition 2.7, the Capture Survey Trip Report for Ma Wat River Northern Meander (Version 2) for the Project was submitted on 24 December 2013 by the Environmental Team (ET) and verified by the Independent Environmental Checker (IEC) on 6 January 2014.

The construction phase of the Contract under the EP and the Environmental Monitoring and Audit (EM&A) programme of the contract commenced on 21 November 2013. The impact environmental monitoring and audit includes air quality and noise monitoring.

This report documents the findings of EM&A works conducted in the period between 1 and 31 January 2017. As informed by the Contractor, construction activities in the reporting period were:

- Site clearance
- Ground investigation
- Pipe laying
- Retaining wall construction
- Noise Barrier
- Excavation
- Backfilling
- Drainage
- Temporary bridge construction
- House Construction
- Foot Bridge demolition
- Bridge construction
- Piling

Reporting Change

There was no reporting change required in the reporting period.

Breaches of Action and Limit Levels for Air Quality

No exceedance of Action and Limit Level was recorded for 1-hour and 24-hour TSP monitoring in the reporting period.

Breaches of Action and Limit Levels for Noise

No Action or Limit Level exceedance of construction noise was recorded in the reporting month. No noise complaints related to 0700 – 1900 hours on normal weekdays was received and followed by Environmental Team in the reporting month.

Complaint, Notification of Summons and Successful Prosecution

One (1) air-related complaint was received on 13 January 2017 and followed up by the Environmental Team in the reporting month. The details of the complaint are described in Section 4.6.4 and the full complaint investigation report is annexed in Appendix M.

No notification of summons and successful prosecution was received in the reporting period.

Future Key Issues

Key issues to be considered in the coming month include:

- Properly store and label oils and chemicals on site;
- Chemical, chemical waste and waste management;
- Collection of construction waste should be carried out regularly;
- Properly maintain all drainage facilities and wheel washing facilities on site;
- Exposed slopes should be covered up properly if no temporary work will be conducted;
- Quieter powered mechanical equipment should be used;
- Suppress dust generated from excavation activities and haul road traffic; and
- Tree protective measures for all retained trees should be well maintained.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

- 1.1.1. Tolo Highway and Fanling Highway are the expressways in the North East New Territories (NENT) connecting Sha Tin, Tai Po and Fanling. These highways form a vital part of the strategic Route 9, which links Hong Kong Island to the boundary at Shenzhen. At present, this section of Route 9 is a dual 3-lane carriageway. However, at several major interchanges along this section of Route 9, the highway is a dual-2 lane carriageway only. Severe congestion is a frequent occurrence during the peak periods, particularly in the Kowloon-bound direction.
- 1.1.2. The objective of the Project "Widening of Tolo Highway / Fanling Highway between Island House Interchange and Fanling" is to widen Tolo Highway and Fanling Highway to dual 4-lane carriageway in order to alleviate the current traffic congestion problems and to cope with the increasing transport demands to and from the urban areas and also cross boundary traffic.
- 1.1.3. The Project is a designated project and governed by an Environmental Permit (EP-324/2008) issued by the EPD on 23 December 2008. Subsequently, the EPD issued Variation of Environmental Permits of EP-324/2008/A, EP-324/2008/B and EP-324/2008/C on 31 January 2012, 17 March 2014 and 27 March 2015 respectively. The current valid VEP was applied on 19 August 2015 and the VEP (EP-324/2008/D) was subsequently granted on 27 August 2015.
- 1.1.4. The scope of the Project comprises mainly:-
 - (i) Widening of a 5.7 km section of Tolo Highway and 3.0 km section of Fanling Highway between Island House Interchange and Wo Hop Shek Interchange from the existing dual 3-lane to dual 4-lane, including construction of new vehicular bridges;
 - (ii) Widening of interchange sections at Island House Interchange, Tai Po North Interchange, and Lam Kam Road Interchange from dual 2-lane to dual 3-lane, except Sha Tin bound carriageway at Tai Po North Interchange, which is widened from 3-lane to 4-lane, including realignment of various slip roads:
 - (iii) Modification and reconstruction of highways, vehicular bridges, underpasses and footbridges.
- 1.1.5. The construction works for this Project will be delivered in 2 stages i.e. Stage 1 (between Island House Interchange and Tai Hang) and Stage 2 (between Tai Hang and Wo Hop Shek Interchange). Stage 2 would be implemented under two works contracts. Contract No. HY/2012/06 "Widening of Fanling Highway Tai Hang to Wo Hop Shek Interchange" and the entrusted portion to CEDD under Contract No. CV/2012/09 "Liantang/Heung Yuen Wai Boundary Control Point Site Formation and Infrastructure Works Contract 3". This report focuses on Contract No. HY2012/06 "Widening of Fanling Highway Tai Hang to Wo Hop Shek Interchange" in Stage 2 of the Project only.
- 1.1.6. Hyder-Arup-Black and Veatch Joint Venture (HABVJV) are appointed by Highways Department (HyD) as the consultants for the design and construction assignment for the Tolo project under Agreement No. CE 58/2000 Supplementary Agreement No. 3 (SA3) (i.e. the Engineer for the Contract).
- 1.1.7. China State Construction Engineering (Hong Kong) Ltd. (CSHK) was commissioned as the Contractor of the Contract.
- 1.1.8. AECOM Asia Co. Ltd. was commissioned by China State Construction Engineering (Hong Kong) Limited as the Environmental Team (ET) to undertake the Environmental Monitoring and Audit (EM&A) works for the Contract and Mott MacDonald Hong Kong Ltd. acts as the Independent Environmental Checker (IEC) for the Contract.
- 1.1.9. The construction phase of the Contract under the EP commenced on 21 November 2013.
- 1.1.10. According to the updated EM&A Manual of Stage 2 of the Project, there is a need of an EM&A programme including air quality and noise monitoring. The EM&A programme for Stage 2 of the Project commenced on 21 November 2013.

1.2 Scope of Report

1.2.1 This is the thirty-ninth monthly EM&A Report under the Contract No. HY/2012/06 "Widening of Fanling Highway – Tai Hang to Wo Hop Shek Interchange. This report presents a summary of the environmental monitoring and audit works, list of activities and mitigation measures proposed by the ET for the Contract in January 2017.

1.3 Project Organization

1.3.1 The project organization structure is shown in Appendix A. The key personnel contact names and numbers are summarized in Table 1.1.

1.4 Summary of Construction Works

- 1.4.3 The Construction Programme is shown in Appendix B.
- 1.4.4 The general layout plan of the Project site showing the contract areas is shown in Figure 1.1.
- 1.4.5 The environmental mitigation measures implementation schedule are presented in Appendix C.

1.5 Summary of EM&A Programme Requirements

- 1.5.1 The EM&A programme required environmental monitoring for air quality, noise and environmental site inspections for air quality, water quality, noise, waste management, ecology, and landscape and visual impact. The EM&A requirements for each parameter described in the following sections include:-
 - All monitoring parameters;
 - Monitoring schedules for the reporting period and forthcoming months;
 - Action and Limit levels for all environmental parameters:
 - Event / Action Plan:
 - Environmental mitigation measures, as recommended in the Project EIA study final report; and
 - Environmental requirement in contract documents.

2 AIR QUALITY MONITORING

2.1 Monitoring Requirements

2.1.1 In accordance with the updated EM&A Manual, baseline 1-hour and 24-hour TSP levels at one air quality monitoring station was established. Impact 1-hour TSP monitoring was conducted for at least three times every 6 days, while impact 24-hour TSP monitoring was carried out for at least once every 6 days. The Action and Limit level of the air quality monitoring is provided in Appendix D.

2.2 Monitoring Equipment

2.2.1 24-hour TSP air quality monitoring was performed using High Volume Sampler (HVS) located at each designated monitoring station. The HVS meets all the requirements of the updated EM&A Manual. Portable direct reading dust meters were used to carry out the 1-hour TSP monitoring. Brand and model of the equipment is given in Table 2.1.

2.3 Monitoring Locations

2.3.1 The monitoring station was set up at the proposed location in accordance with updated EM&A Manual. Table 2.2 describes details of the monitoring station. The locations are shown in Figure 1.2a.

2.4 Monitoring Parameters and Frequency

2.4.1 Table 2.3 summarizes the monitoring parameters, frequency and duration of impact TSP monitoring.

2.5 Monitoring Methodology

2.5.1 24-hour TSP Monitoring

- (a) The HVS was installed in the vicinity of the air sensitive receivers. The following criteria were considered in the installation of the HVS.
 - (i) A horizontal platform with appropriate support to secure the sampler against gusty wind was provided.
 - (ii) The distance between the HVS and any obstacles, such as buildings, was at least twice the height that the obstacle protrudes above the HVS.
 - (iii) A minimum of 2 meters separation from walls, parapets and penthouse for rooftop sampler.
 - (iv) A minimum of 2 meters separation from any supporting structure, measured horizontally.
 - (v) No furnace or incinerator flues nearby.
 - (vi) Airflow around the sampler was unrestricted.
 - (vii) Permission was obtained to set up the samplers and access to the monitoring stations.
 - (viii) A secured supply of electricity was obtained to operate the samplers.
 - (ix) The sampler was located more than 20 meters from any dripline.
 - Any wire fence and gate, required to protect the sampler, did not obstruct the monitoring process.
 - (xi) Flow control accuracy was kept within ±2.5% deviation over 24-hour sampling period.

(b) Preparation of Filter Papers

- (i) Glass fibre filters, G810 were labelled and sufficient filters that were clean and without pinholes were selected.
- (ii) All filters were equilibrated in the conditioning environment for 24 hours before weighing. The conditioning environment temperature was around 25 °C and not variable by more than ±3 °C; the relative humidity (RH) was < 50% and not variable by more than ±5%. A convenient working RH was 40%.
- (iii) All filter papers were prepared and analysed by ALS Technichem (HK) Pty Ltd., which is a HOKLAS accredited laboratory and has comprehensive quality assurance and quality control programmes.

(c) Field Monitoring

- (i) The power supply was checked to ensure the HVS works properly.
- (ii) The filter holder and the area surrounding the filter were cleaned.
- (iii) The filter holder was removed by loosening the four bolts and a new filter, with stamped number upward, on a supporting screen was aligned carefully.
- (iv) The filter was properly aligned on the screen so that the gasket formed an airtight seal on the outer edges of the filter.
- (v) The swing bolts were fastened to hold the filter holder down to the frame. The pressure applied was sufficient to avoid air leakage at the edges.
- (vi) Then the shelter lid was closed and was secured with the aluminum strip.
- (vii) The HVS was warmed-up for about 5 minutes to establish run-temperature conditions.
- (viii) A new flow rate record sheet was set into the flow recorder.
- (ix) On site temperature and atmospheric pressure readings were taken and the flow rate of the HVS was checked and adjusted at around 1.1 m³/min, and complied with the range specified in the updated EM&A Manual (i.e. 0.6-1.7 m³/min).
- (x) The programmable digital timer was set for a sampling period of 24 hrs, and the starting time, weather condition and the filter number were recorded.
- (xi) The initial elapsed time was recorded.
- (xii) At the end of sampling, on site temperature and atmospheric pressure readings were taken and the final flow rate of the HVS was checked and recorded.
- (xiii) The final elapsed time was recorded.

- (xiv) The sampled filter was removed carefully and folded in half length so that only surfaces with collected particulate matter were in contact.
- (xv) It was then placed in a clean plastic envelope and sealed.
- (xvi) All monitoring information was recorded on a standard data sheet.
- (xvii) Filters were then sent to ALS Technichem (HK) Pty Ltd. for analysis.

(d) Maintenance and Calibration

- (i) The HVS and its accessories were maintained in good working condition, such as replacing motor brushes routinely and checking electrical wiring to ensure a continuous power supply.
- (ii) 5-point calibration of the HVS was conducted using TE-5025A Calibration Kit prior to the commencement of baseline monitoring. Bi-monthly 5-point calibration of the HVS will be carried out during impact monitoring.
- (iii) Calibration certificate of the HVSs are provided in Appendix E.

2.5.2 1-hour TSP Monitoring

(a) Measuring Procedures

The measuring procedures of the 1-hour dust meter were in accordance with the Manufacturer's Instruction Manual as follows:-

- (i) Turn the power on.
- (ii) Close the air collecting opening cover.
- (iii) Push the "TIME SETTING" switch to [BG].
- (iv) Push "START/STOP" switch to perform background measurement for 6 seconds.
- (v) Turn the knob at SENSI ADJ position to insert the light scattering plate.
- (vi) Leave the equipment for 1 minute upon "SPAN CHECK" is indicated in the display.
- (vii) Push "START/STOP" switch to perform automatic sensitivity adjustment. This measurement takes 1 minute.
- (viii) Pull out the knob and return it to MEASURE position.
- (ix) Push the "TIME SETTING" switch the time set in the display to 3 hours.
- (x) Lower down the air collection opening cover.
- (xi) Push "START/STOP" switch to start measurement.

(b) Maintenance and Calibration

- (i) The 1-hour TSP meter was calibrated at 1-year intervals against a continuous particulate TEOM Monitor, Series 1400ab. Calibration certificates of the Laser Dust Monitors are provided in Appendix E.
- (ii) 1-hour validation checking of the TSP meter against HVS is carried out yearly at the air quality monitoring locations.

2.6 Monitoring Schedule for the Reporting period

2.6.1 The schedule for environmental monitoring in January 2017 is provided in Appendix F.

2.7 Results and Observations

2.7.1 The monitoring results for 1-hour TSP and 24-hour TSP are summarized in Table 2.4 and 2.5 respectively. Detailed impact air quality monitoring results are presented in Appendix G.

- 2.7.2 The major dust source during the monitoring was mainly from nearby traffic emission.
- 2.7.3 All 1-hour and 24-hour TSP results were below the Action and Limit Level at all monitoring locations in the reporting period.
- 2.7.4 The event action plan is annexed in Appendix J.
- 2.7.5 Weather information including wind speed and wind direction is annexed in Appendix H. The information was obtained from the Hong Kong Observatory Tai Po and Tai Mei Tuk Automatic Weather Stations.

3 NOISE MONITORING

3.1 Monitoring Requirements

3.1.1 In accordance with the EM&A Manual, impact noise monitoring was conducted for at least once per week during the construction phase of the Contract. The Action and Limit level of the noise monitoring is provided in Appendix D.

3.2 Monitoring Equipment

3.2.1 Noise monitoring was performed using sound level meter at each designated monitoring station. The sound level meters deployed comply with the International Electrotechnical Commission Publications (IEC) 651:1979 (Type 1) and 804:1985 (Type 1) specifications. Acoustic calibrator was deployed to check the sound level meters at a known sound pressure level. Brand and model of the equipment is given in Table 3.1.

3.3 Monitoring Locations

3.3.1 Monitoring stations M2 and M3 were set up at the proposed locations in accordance with updated EM&A Manual. Figure 1.2a-b shows the locations of the monitoring stations. Table 3.2 describes the details of the monitoring stations.

3.4 Monitoring Parameters and Frequency

3.4.1 Table 3.3 summarizes the monitoring parameters, frequency and duration of impact noise monitoring.

3.5 Monitoring Methodology

3.5.1 Monitoring Procedure

- (a) Façade measurement was made at monitoring station M3, while free-field measurement was made at monitoring station M2.
- (b) The sound level meter was set on a tripod at a height of 1.2 m above the ground for free-field measurements at monitoring station M2.
- (c) The battery condition was checked to ensure the correct functioning of the meter.
- (d) Parameters such as frequency weighting, the time weighting and the measurement time were set as follows:-
 - (i) frequency weighting: A
 - (ii) time weighting: Fast
 - (iii) time measurement: $L_{eq(30-minutes)}$ during non-restricted hours i.e. 07:00-1900 on normal weekdays; $L_{eq(5-minutes)}$ during restricted hours i.e. 19:00-23:00 and 23:00-07:00 of normal weekdays, whole day of Sundays and Public Holidays
- (e) Prior to and after each noise measurement, the meter was calibrated using the acoustic calibrator for 94dB(A) at 1000 Hz. If the difference in the calibration level before and after measurement was more than 1 dB(A), the measurement would be considered invalid and repeat of noise measurement would be required after re-calibration or repair of the equipment.
- (f) During the monitoring period, the L_{eq} , L_{10} and L_{90} were recorded. In addition, site conditions and noise sources were recorded on a standard record sheet.
- (g) Noise measurement was paused during periods of high intrusive noise (e.g. dog barking, helicopter noise) if possible. Observations were recorded when intrusive noise was unavoidable.
- (h) Noise monitoring was cancelled in the presence of fog, rain, wind with a steady speed exceeding 5m/s, or wind with gusts exceeding 10m/s.

3.5.2 Maintenance and Calibration

- (a) The microphone head of the sound level meter was cleaned with soft cloth at regular intervals.
- (b) The meter and calibrator were sent to the supplier or HOKLAS laboratory to check and calibrate at yearly intervals.
- (c) Calibration certificates of the sound level meters and acoustic calibrators are provided in Appendix E.

3.6 Monitoring Schedule for the Reporting period

3.6.1 The schedule for environmental monitoring in January 2017 is provided in Appendix F.

3.7 Monitoring Results

3.7.1 The monitoring results for construction noise are summarized in Table 3.4 and the monitoring data is provided in Appendix I.

- 3.7.2 No Action or Limit Level exceedance of construction noise was recorded in the reporting month. No noise complaints related to 0700 1900 hours on normal weekdays was received and followed by Environmental Team in the reporting month.
- 3.7.3 Major noise sources during noise monitoring in the reporting period were mainly road traffic noise.
- 3.7.4 The event action plan is annexed in Appendix J.

4 ENVIRONMENTAL SITE INSPECTION AND AUDIT

4.1 Site Inspection

- 4.1.1 Site Inspections were carried out on a weekly basis to monitor the implementation of proper environmental pollution control and mitigation measures for the Contract. In the reporting period, 4 site inspections were carried out respectively on 3, 10, 19 and 24 January 2017 for the Contract. While no specific observation was recorded, recommendations on remedial actions were given to the Contractor for precautionary purpose.
- 4.1.2 The environmental site inspections summaries are provided in Appendix K.
- 4.1.3 Particular observations during the site inspections are described below:

Air Quality

- 4.1.4 Water sprayed on open site areas was found inadequate at SA324 and SA320. The Contractor should spray the open site areas with adequate water to prevent windblown dust emission.
- 4.1.5 Public access road at SA328 was observed dusty. The Contractor should provide sufficient measures to keep the public access road clear of dusty materials.
- 4.1.6 Exposed stockpile of dusty materials were found at SA340. The Contractor should cover the stockpile entirely by impervious sheeting.

Noise

4.1.7 No adverse observation was identified in the reporting period.

Water Quality

4.1.8 Silts and debris were found near the entrance of drainage system at NB76. The Contractor should remove the sandy materials and implement measures to prevent silts and debris from entering the drainage system.

Chemical and Waste Management

- 4.1.9 Construction materials and wastes were found near existing vegetation at SA320. The Contractor should remove the construction materials and wastes to keep the site clean and tidy.
- 4.1.10 General refuse was found scattered on ground at SA320. The Contractor should remove the general refuse and keep the site clean and tidy.
- 4.1.11 Chemical container without drip tray was found at SA320. The Contractor should provide secondary containment to avoid potential leakage.
- 4.1.12 Construction wastes and materials were found scattered on ground at SA325 and SA326. The Contractor should remove the construction wastes and materials to keep the site clean and tidy.

Landscape and Visual Impact

4.1.13 No adverse observation was identified in the reporting period.

Miscellaneous

4.1.14 Stagnant water was found at SA340. The Contractor should remove the water or apply larvicidal oil to prevent mosquito breeding.

4.2 Advice on the Solid and Liquid Waste Management Status

- 4.2.1 The Contractor has registered as chemical waste producers for the Contract. C&D material sorting was carried out on site. Sufficient numbers of receptacles were available for general refuse collection.
- 4.2.2 As advised by the Contractor, 1,650 m³ of inert C&D material was generated in the reporting month (360 m³ disposed of as public fill to Tuen Mun 38, 438 m³ of inert C&D materials was reused on site, 517 m³ of inert C&D materials was reused in other projects and 335 m³ was broken concrete). For C&D wastes, 115 m³ of general refuse was disposed of at NENT landfill, 72 kg of paper/cardboard packaging, 845 kg of plastics and 0 kg of metals were collected by recycling Contractors, and 0 kg of chemical wastes was collected by licensed Contractors in the reporting period.
- 4.2.3 The actual amounts of different types of waste generated by the activities of the Project in the reporting period are shown in Table 4.1.

4.5 Summary of Exceedances of the Environmental Quality Performance Limit

- 4.5.1 All 1-hour and 24-hour TSP monitoring results complied with the Action / Limit Levels in the reporting period.
- 4.5.2 No Action or Limit Level exceedance of construction noise was recorded in the reporting month. No noise complaints related to 0700 1900 hours on normal weekdays was received and followed by Environmental Team in the reporting month.

4.6 Summary of Complaints, Notification of Summons and Successful Prosecutions

- 4.6.1 The Environmental Complaint Handling Procedure is annexed in Figure 4.1.
- 4.6.2 One (1) air-related complaint was received on 13 January 2017 and followed up by the Environmental Team in the reporting month. The details of the complaint are described in Section 4.6.4 and the full complaint investigation report is annexed in Appendix M.
- 4.6.3 No notification of summons and successful prosecution was received in the reporting period.
- 4.6.4 A complaint was received by the 1823 enquiry and complaint hotline on 5 January 2017. The complaint was referred to the Environmental Team by the Contractor on 13 January 2017.
- 4.6.5 A complainant complained against the dust emission generated by the Widening of Fanling Highway construction site on Tai Wo Service Road West near Tai Hang Village.
- 4.6.6 The complainant also complained that Highway Department did not conduct road surface cleansing, which affects residents' health. He/she requires the Highway Department to follow up.
- 4.6.7 Statistics on complaints, notifications of summons and successful prosecutions are summarized in Appendix L.

5 FUTURE KEY ISSUES

5.1 Construction Programme for the Coming Months

5.2 Key Issues for the Coming Month

- 5.2.1 Key issues to be considered in February 2017:-
 - Properly store and label oils and chemicals on site;
 - Chemical, chemical waste and waste management;
 - Collection of construction waste should be carried out regularly;
 - Properly maintain all drainage facilities and wheel washing facilities on site;
 - Exposed slopes should be covered up properly if no temporary work will be conducted;
 - Quieter powered mechanical equipment should be used;
 - Suppress dust generated from excavation activities and haul road traffic; and
 - Tree protective measures for all retained trees should be well maintained.

5.3 Monitoring Schedule for the Coming Month

5.3.1 The tentative schedule for environmental monitoring in February 2017 is provided in Appendix F.

6 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

6.1 Conclusions

- 6.1.1 The construction phase and EM&A programme of the Contract commenced on 21 November 2013.
- 6.1.2 All 1-hour and 24-hour TSP monitoring results complied with the Action / Limit Levels in the reporting period.
- 6.1.3 No Action or Limit Level exceedance of construction noise was recorded in the reporting month. No noise complaints related to 0700 1900 hours on normal weekdays was received and followed by Environmental Team in the reporting month.
- 6.1.4 4 environmental site inspections were carried out in January 2017. Recommendations on remedial actions were given to the Contractors for the deficiencies identified during the site audits.
- 6.1.5 One (1) air-related complaint was received on 13 January 2017 and followed up by the Environmental Team in the reporting month. The details of the complaint are described in Section 4.6.4 and the full complaint investigation report is annexed in Appendix M.
- 6.1.6 No notification of summons and successful prosecution was received in the reporting period.

6.2 Recommendations

6.2.1 According to the environmental site inspections performed in the reporting period, the following recommendations on remedial actions were provided to the Contractor for precautionary purpose:

Air Quality Impact

- The Contractor should spray the open site areas with adequate water to prevent windblown dust emission.
- The Contractor should provide sufficient measures to keep the public access road clear of dusty materials.
- The Contractor should cover the stockpile entirely by impervious sheeting.

Noise Impact

No adverse observation was identified in the reporting period.

Water Quality Impact

 The Contractor should remove the sandy materials and implement measures to prevent silts and debris from entering the drainage system.

Chemical and Waste Management

- The Contractor should remove the construction materials and wastes to keep the site clean and tidy.
- The Contractor should remove the general refuse and keep the site clean and tidy.
- The Contractor should provide secondary containment to avoid potential leakage.
- The Contractor should remove the construction wastes and materials to keep the site clean and tidy.

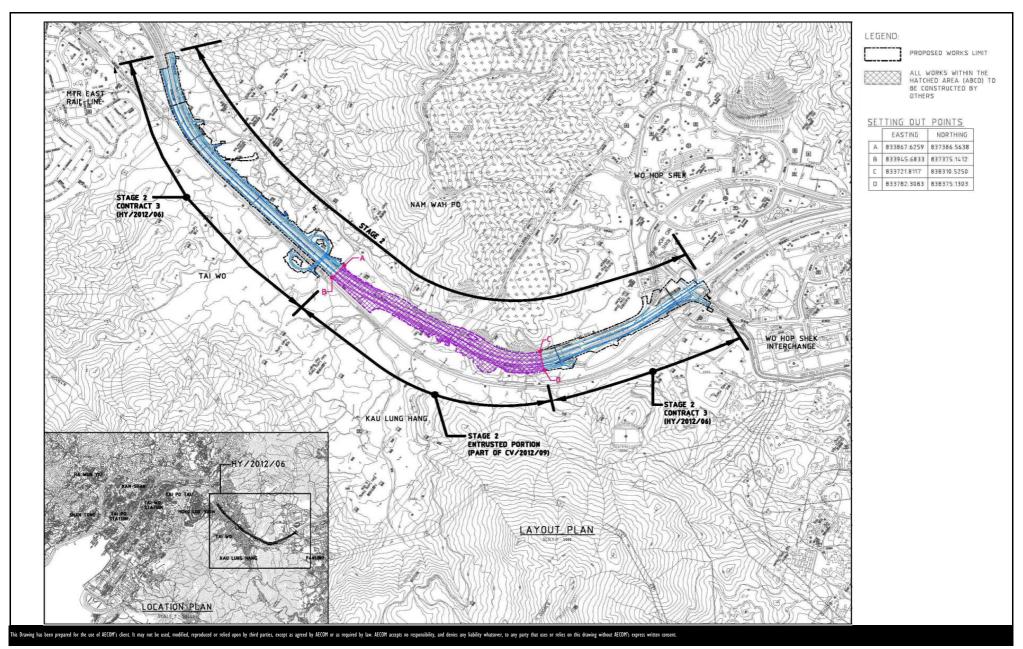


WIDENING OF FANLING HIGHWAY

Layout Plan

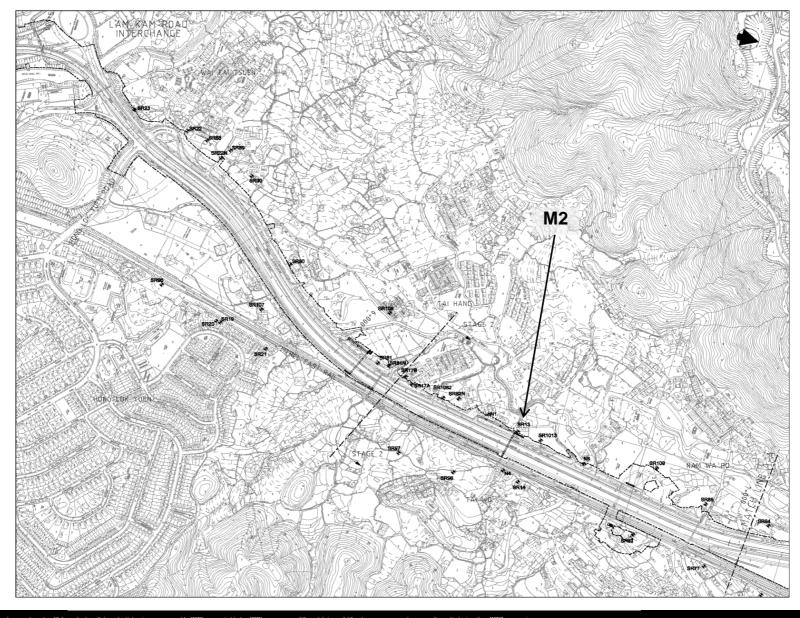

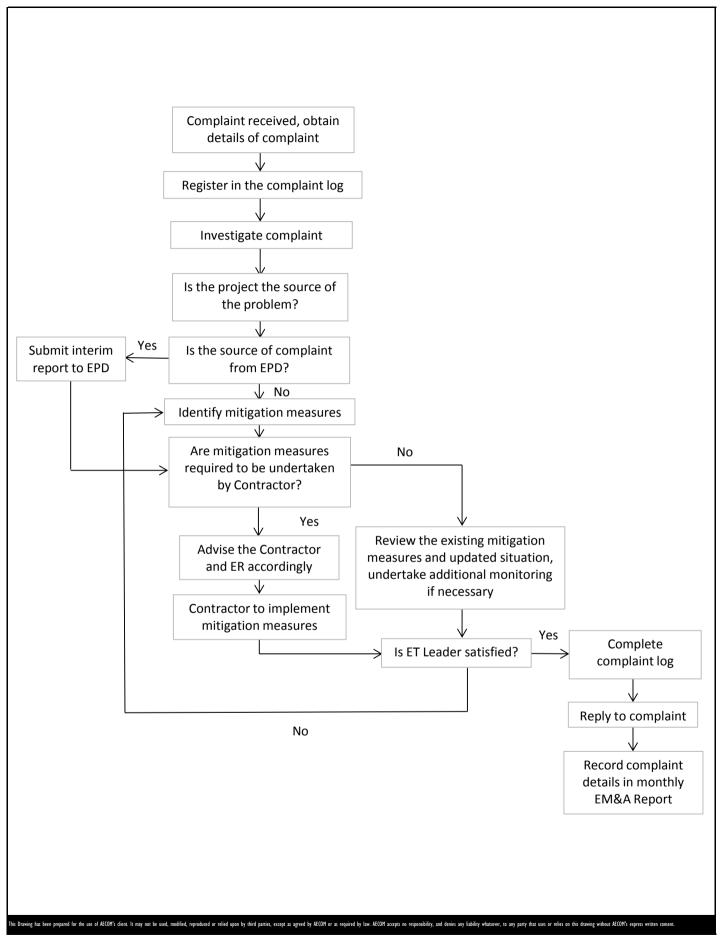





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
Graphical Presentation of Impact 24-hour TSP Monitoring Results

The 1823 enquiry and complaint hotline referred a complaint on 13 January 2017.

A complainant complained against the dust emission generated by the Widening of Fanling Highway construction site on Tai Wo Service Road West near Tai Hang Village.

The complainant also complained that Highway Department did not conduct road surface cleansing, which affects residents' health. He/she now requires the Highway Department to follow up.

Investigation and Findings:

According to the Contractor (China State Construction Engineering (HK) Ltd.), road surface cleansing works along Tai Wo Service Road West and its branch roads (Figure 1) were carried out immediately after receiving the complaint on 5 January 2017.

Following the receipt of the complaint, the Contractor has enhanced water bowser operation frequency from once a day to four times a day, in which cleansing works are scheduled twice in the morning and twice in the afternoon. In addition, the Contractor would further increase the frequency of road cleansing work if dusty condition was observed.

According to the Contractor, construction activities near Tai Wo Service Road West during 2nd to 6th January 2017 include pipe laying, excavation, backfilling, concreting work, formworking, steel bar fixing and noise barrier installation. The construction work will inevitably lead to dust emission, which are mainly excavation, concreting work and material handling.

The Contractor implemented dust suppression measures at the area including:




Figure 2 – Road Surface Cleansing

- Daily road surface cleansing (Figure 2).
- Water sprays for unpaved haul roads and active construction areas to suppress dust generation (Figure 3).
- Wheel washing facilities for every vehicle exit point to remove any dusty materials from vehicles body and wheels before leaving the construction site (Figure 4).
- Water spays for dust emission construction activities (Figure 5).

The Contractor was reminded to carry out mitigation measures to prevent recurrence of air-related complaints:

- Spraying active construction areas with sufficient water for efficient dust suppression.
- Covering exposed stockpiles to prevent windblown dust emission.
- Increasing the frequency of road surface cleansing if necessary.

The complaint is likely to be project-related.

The Contractor is advised to implement the mitigation measures as stated in "Recommended Mitigation Measures".
